Our five core values are central to our mission, our work, and how we interact daily with our communities.

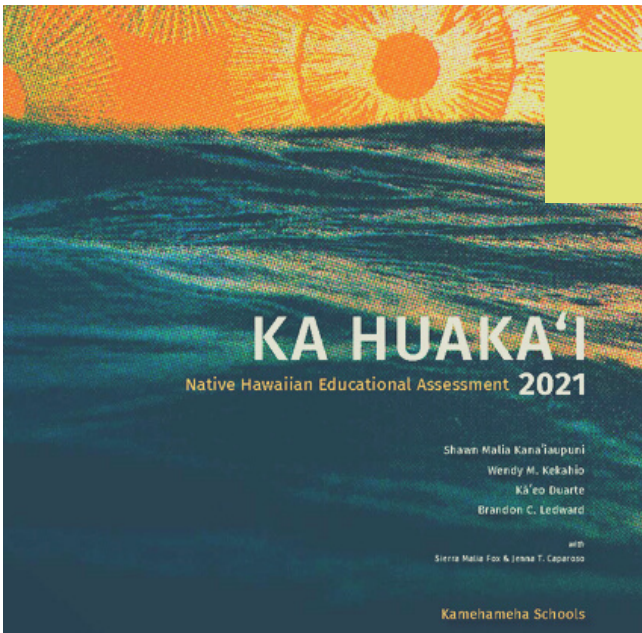
